Key Race of the Day – Race 6 – Claiming (\$8k) – About 7 Furlongs (Turf)

The Tuesday finale features a field of seven fillies and mares that are in for \$8,000. Several runners exit the Molson Cup, which was run on Prince of Wales Day and looking at those that competed in that event, **#3 Alta Calibre** recorded a big effort, finishing second. She was part of the pace and managed to stick around, while racing first off the claim for trainer Ken Albu. Her best efforts have been on the grass and with that most recent race being her first route of the season, one would think she improves here. The cutback from a mile and a sixteenth also should aid her. **#1 Crumlin Trouble** could give her a bit of a headache early on, as she'll likely be forwardly placed from the rail. She jumps up in class but turns back from one mile to today's seven-furlong distance. She hasn't had a ton of time to regroup, but she's easy to respect based on her lone local performance. If the tempo ends up being lively, watch out for **#5 Dreams and Schemes**. This late-running mare closed in the Molson Cup to finish fourth, after being last at one point. She has a powerful late turn of foot but needs some pace to run at, as she often leaves herself with too much to do late. She reunites with jockey Jeffrey Alderson, who has been riding well at the meet and piloted her to her lone win at Fort Erie back in early July.
